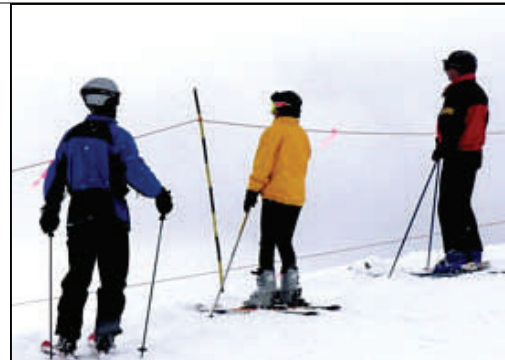

Busy Season, Multiple Tone-Outs

Has it been 10 or 11 tone outs for service in the last two months? As of this writing, the group has been tested, driven, snow-shoed, mapped, beacons, probed, elpered, snowmobiled, and kept up all night. Also, the group has been asked more than once to assist in other county/state searches. Here is a list, not necessarily in the correct order:

- Mt Rose to assist in finding 3 out of bound skiers.
- Communication station repair assist near Monitor Pass with Tucker and snowmobiles

- ELT search for plane (at Douglas Airport)
- Call out for stranded person at Leviathan Mine
- Power pole damaged, all night guard duty
- Maggie's Peak avalanche search/recovery
- Mt Rose/Slide Mt avalanche search, old slide
- Pine Nut/Sunrise search assist for Lyon Co
- Out of bounds skier at Heavenly (with collateral damage)
- Three out of bounds skiers at Heavenly
